Campers explore the exciting world of science, technology, engineering, art, and math (STEAM) through building projects, experiments, and design challenges. Sharing ideas, asking questions, and making predictions are encouraged!



Robust outdoor play and structured games help campers learn sportsmanship and develop their physical strength and endurance. Campers learn critical thinking and problem solving by participating in board games and team challenges with their peers.



Campers express themselves by participating in hands-on visual arts, including photography, videography, drawing, and painting. Campers develop planning skills by working on project-based activities with their peers and will participate in group performances or discussions, debates, and other public speaking opportunities.



Social and emotional growth is nurtured through camper- and teacher-led activities that promote a feeling of community and belonging. Campers learn through open-ended activities that give them a chance to apply problem-solving skills and collaborate with friends.



From imaginative games that stimulate cognitive development to hands-on experiences, campers will engage in activities that enhance motor skills. These activities not only set the stage for academic success, but also foster social, emotional, and physical growth.

Forms

After completing online registration, parents will receive additional forms via DocuSign. Campers may not attend summer camp at The Rhoades School until all required documents are submitted, including the registration form, summer camp waiver, immunization records, and a copy of the insurance card. Payment

One week's tuition is due at the time of enrollment. The deposit will be applied to the final week of camp.

Weekly camp fees are due every Monday. A \$25 late fee will be charged if payment is not received by 12 pm Tuesday.

Cancellation

If you enroll in camp and your plans change, you can receive a full refund/credit for camp tuition, less registration fee. **Program changes are made by the parent through the camp registration portal only and must be received 2 weeks prior to the camp start date.** Participants who do not attend their registered camp week, or who do not cancel two weeks prior to start date, will not receive a refund or credit. By submitting your payment, you are agreeing to the policy outlined above.

Student Personal Electronic Devices & Cell Phones

If a camper brings a cell phone or smart device (including smart watch) to school, the device must be turned off and in the camper's backpack. Cell phones and smart watches are not permitted to be used during the school day. See the [Parent & Student SEG handbook for more details.](#)

Lunch, Snacks & Sunscreen

Campers should bring 2 snacks (morning and afternoon) and a lunch daily. We cannot reheat or refrigerate any lunches. No glass water bottles or containers. Please apply sunscreen to your child prior to coming to camp and provide a hat they may wear during outside play time (please label the hat with your child's name).

Medication

All prescriptions medications and **over-the-counter products must be accompanied by written physician's instructions and must be in the original container with the child's name and appropriate information noted.** In addition, parents are required to fill out a [Medication Administration Authorization form](#) to all school personnel to administer medication.

Allergy, Asthma and/ or Diabetes Action Plan

If your child has a food allergy, asthma, diabetes, and/ or requires student support please make sure to work with camp staff to have an action plan in place prior to the beginning of camp. Action plans must be completed by a physician and submitted to Ansuya Bose, Dean of Students, at abose@rhoadesschool.com as soon as possible. Your camper will not be able to attend camp until we receive an action plan. Please contact Ansuya Bose for questions regarding action plans.
